**Aims:** To highlight the talent, creativity and ingenuity of young rural Victorians and in doing so encourage entrants to be role models across local communities. To encourage and reward enthusiastic, skilful and industrious young people living or having an involvement in rural environments. To assist all entrants through their participation to develop strong communication and leadership qualities and to directly assist the winner through the support of a bursary. **Requirements:** Aged over 20 and less than 30 years at the 1<sup>st</sup> May of the year of the State Final. Enthusiastic and knowledgeable about rural life and affairs, and agricultural shows. Able to spend the required time at the local Show, Group Level finals and the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.

### **Important Information**

Any rider riding a horse at an EFA or affiliated event, must wear protective headgear to the current Australian, European or American Standard. The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Riders without approved headgear shall be ineligible to compete until rectified.

The use of tranquillisers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of animals is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that test for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under veterinary supervision.

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any Show held by or affiliated with VAS Ltd. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.

Confirmation forms for district entrants must be collected from the office after Sept 23rd and before the show. All other entries will be posted out. Any alterations that need to be made are to be reported to the office as soon as possible.
